To earn and maintain Accreditation, schools must:

- Meet AdvancED Accreditation Standards for Quality Schools
- Engage in Process of Continuous Improvement
- Demonstrate Quality Assurance through Internal and External Review



AdvancED Standards for Quality Schools

Comprehensive statements of quality practices and conditions that research and best practice indicate are necessary for schools to achieve improved student performance and organizational effectiveness



AdvancED Standards for Quality Schools

- 1. Vision and Purpose
- 2. Governance and Leadership
- 3. Teaching and Learning
- 4. Documenting and Using Results
- 5. Resources and Support Systems
- 6. Stakeholder Communications and Relationships
- 7. Commitment to Continuous Improvement





AdvancED Standards for Quality Schools

Standards (7)

 comprehensive statements of quality practices and conditions

Indicators (56)

 operational definitions or descriptions of practices and processes

Impact Statements (7)

 characteristics, processes, and actions that would be observable and verifiable in a school that effectively implements each standard



AdvancED Accreditation Standards

- Cross state, regional, national and international boundaries
- Focus on factors contributing to student learning
- Address variables schools can impact
- Interrelated and form a collective whole
- Supported by research
- Provide system of aligned standards (school, district, service agencies)




Continuous Improvement Process

Schools must select and implement a process. It should:

- comprehensively address four elements of continuous improvement
- help school meet standards
- focus on improvement of student learning and school effectiveness
- satisfy local, state, federal improvement process requirements
- be implemented in systematic, systemic, and sustainable manner

Why are each of these elements important for continuous improvement?




What is Quality Assurance?

- Protecting public trust
- Professional and organizational integrity
 - The school ...
 - strives to deliver on its promise and be what it claims to be
 - fulfills requirements of accreditation
 - is honest and truthful in communicating and reporting
 - engages in professional and ethical behavior
- Internal and external review



Keystone of Quality Assurance





Quality Assurance

Internal Review

The school implements methods to monitor progress and determine effectiveness of efforts

External Review

The school participates in a Quality Assurance Review every five years



Internal Review

Stakeholders are engaged in:

- Assessment of standards and indicators
- Review of systems and processes
- Analysis of current student performance and school effectiveness
- Communicating, understanding and using results



Standards Self-Assessment

Executive Institutional Summary (EIS)

Narrative, tell story, context, history

Standards Self-Assessment (SA)

- Indicator Level Assessments (56)
 - Questions per indicator (1-4)
 - Selected response to each question (rubric)
 - Evidence to support (menu and option to add)
- Standard-Level Contextual Narrative (2 questions)



Internal Review Self-Assessment

- Submitted on-line 6 months to 6 weeks prior to QAR visit
- Opportunity for the school to analyze indicators and demonstrate how it meets the standards
- Available to QAR chair and team prior to visit



External Review

Purpose of Quality Assurance Review:

- Determine extent to which school meets AdvanceD standards
- Assess efficacy of school's improvement efforts
- Evaluate effectiveness of school's quality assurance methods
- Provide high-quality feedback
 - Strengths and opportunities
 - Commendations
 - Required actions

The Hallmark of Accreditation

External Review

QAR visit provides

- Dialogue with professional peers
- Verification, validation, and enrichment of school's accomplishments and improvement efforts
- Valuable feedback to help school improve
- An accreditation recommendation

The QAR visit is the most significant contributor to value and perception of accreditation process.



After the Visit

The school

- Reviews and discusses the Quality Assurance Team Report
- Communicates findings to stakeholders
- Celebrates the rewards of hard work, success and dedication
- Continues to improve
- Submits the Accreditation Progress Report


